The Cities Embracing Jewish Heritage project is a joint initiative of the **Combat Antisemitism Movement (CAM)** and the **European Association for the Preservation and Promotion of Jewish Culture and Heritage (AEPJ)**.

This project encourages cities to participate in the **European Days of Jewish Culture (EDJC2025)**, an event held annually in September to celebrate Jewish heritage through cultural events, exhibitions, and educational activities.

By highlighting the ongoing contributions of Jewish heritage to European society, cities participating in the project are fostering intercultural dialogue, promoting inclusion and combating antisemitism with a proactive approach.
